I got a free copy of NetSuite OneWorld Implementation 2011 R2 through Packt Publishing. No book is going to be good enough to walk someone through a complex ERP implementation, but NetSuite OneWorld Implementation does a good job with the basics. It gives enough information to get someone familiar enough with the software and process to help move the implementation along and speed decisions. I would give this 4 stars but there is one big flaw. The first 25% of the book is spent extolling the virtues of NetSuite and its online model. That fine except that by the time you've bought an implementation book you're not looking to be sold on the value. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful. run as SAAS. By W Boudville Foydel advocates an agile programming methodology for developing business applications within OneWorld. He suggests that this is more robust than the waterfall method. Largely, I tend to agree. Note that Foydel deprecates what is perhaps the most extreme aspect of agile, namely the pair

programming. But other recommendations of agile I think can be usefully done by you. Like the frequent prototyping and showing of these intermediate stages for your end users. This tight feedback loop can be vital to a project's success. It reduces the pernicious possibility of drift. Where the developers end up coding an application which is not germane to the users' needs. OneWorld is shown by the book to integrate all the main needs for a company's management. Accounting is naturally a big ability. There are myriad options for the developer. Including for payment processing and inventory costing (eg. LIFO, FIFO). The other main area of the book deals with sales and marketing. There are aspects common to most sales and marketing efforts. These have been factored out and instantiated into the package. Letting you quickly define such key areas like commissions. OneWorld also offers dashboards that show near real time summaries of incoming data. Useful at the executive level, to keep a close continual eye on events. For some companies turning to OneWorld, the biggest change might be its Software As A Service nature. It differs from loading a package onto your company machines. The benefit offered is that NetSuite handles the storage and backup of OneWorld; freeing your company to focus on its expertise in other areas.

As a NetSuite Administrator and SuiteScript developer, I got a glimpse of what I've been missing. It may be a slow start for those who already work in Implementation team or a seasoned users but it is very helpful if you or your company is thinking about purchasing NetSuite or you are a project manager tasked to implement the system. It will provide you with what to expect when it comes to implementation. It also introduces different way of thinking compared to conventional software implementation process. Although I recommend this book, I definitely would have wanted to see some additional details each of Accounting and Item preferences/configurations. He does cover the very important configurations you should know about but not all.

This book might also be useful if you are a business manager considering a new system for your organization, by providing a real assessment of the current system landscape in relation to NetSuite OneWorld. You should have a basic understanding of business management systems and their implementation. You should also have basic knowledge of NetSuite as an integrated business system and NetSuite OneWorld specifically.
