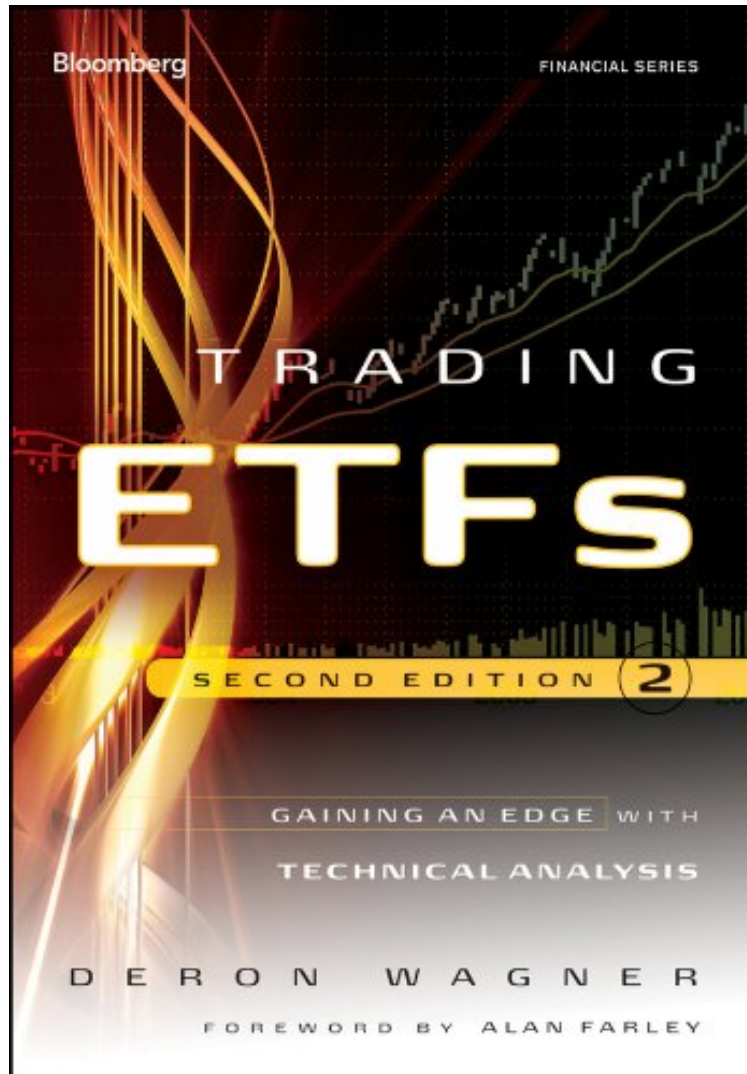

The author uses MAs and resistance and support lines for trading and the scope of trades are very short-term; trying to get a few percent gains in each trade. He should talk, if he is capable, about using momentum indicators, Fibonacci numbers and Elliot waves. If the book is to be on ETFs, sectorial rotations should be
