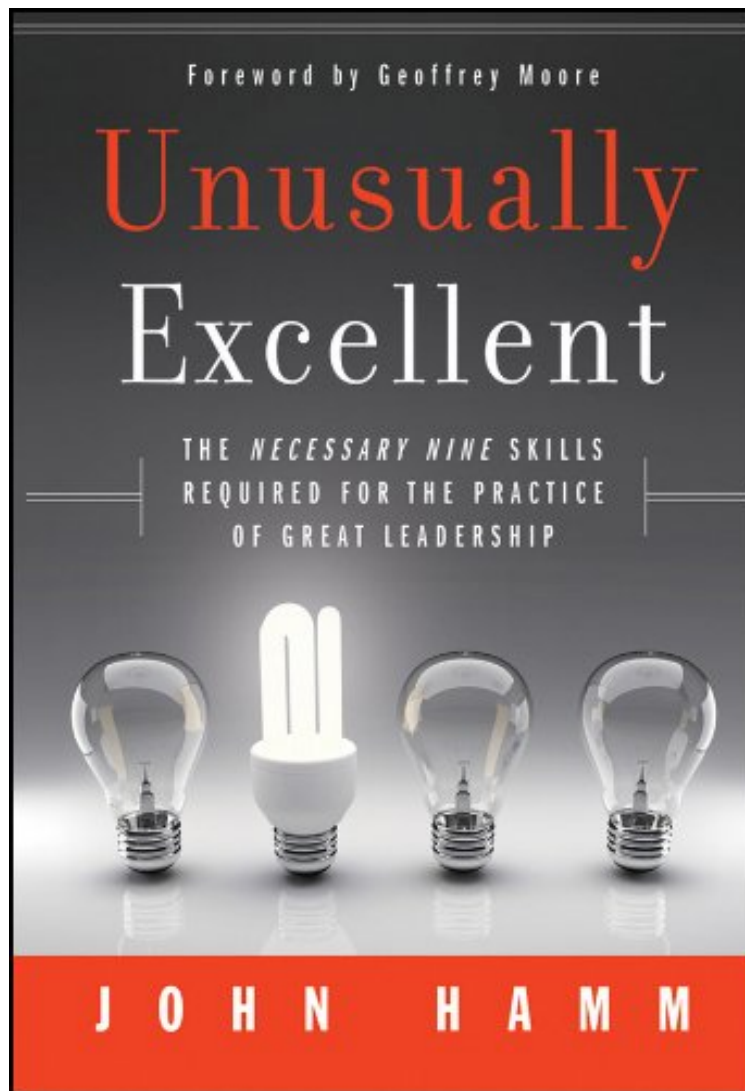

Hamm's model considers both simultaneously.At times, our strengths and weaknesses as

leaders can blind us to the whole tapestry of leadership/management requirements and skills. We focus on what we are particularly good at (or bad at) and forget about the other critical elements, or the context of legacy. The Unusually Excellent model is straightforward and complete, and a great framework within which to consider personal strengths and weaknesses. Even though I wouldn't know a one wood from a putter, the golf and other sports analogies worked for me, and clearly were authentic for Hamm. The model is grounded with compelling stories that bring out the "color" behind the model. The observations in the book match my own experience as a leader. Several times, I made notes in the book as I read along, only to find that point was coming in the next paragraph! The real-world business examples - successes and failures - were also very compelling. Unusually Excellent is an engaging read that will give you new insight into the totality of skills necessary for the integrated discipline of leadership and management.

As a young "leader in training," this book did more than just its original intention: it gave me a look at the basic leadership skills required to be an Unusually Excellent leader, but it also gave them to me in a way that can stick to my brain. With many examples from former, current, good and bad CEOs, this book allowed me to see how the best of the best do it and why they do it that way. John Hamm captures the audience in the very first three pages by talking about a major golf company, which might not sound intriguing- until you read it, that is. Hamm acts a self-deprecating funny guy that modestly tells us where he has been and how he got to where he is today. The essentials of the book are laid out in the first chapter, and they are then repeated at the end of each subject's respected chapter; if this were a college textbook, those pages are the only pages students would HAVE to read. But John Hamm captivates the audience so that we want to do more than just skim the book. This is something you will want to read cover to cover, and over and over. That was not what I expected when I ordered the book. Not only does Hamm give you the basic essentials to being an Unusually Excellent leader, but he also gives you scenarios to recover if something goes wrong. This book seems to do it all: it tells you what to do, how to execute it, where to turn if things start to get slippery, and who did it in the past. The book only covers the "necessary nine skills," but it proves to be a lot of information. But don't worry, ladies and gentleman! John Hamm has you covered- the book is tactfully split up into three sections, each with a focus: Credibility, Competence and Consequence. I don't want to read the book for you, because you won't regret it once you pick it up, but here's what I think is worth telling if you aren't yet convinced: Know who you are. If you know and appreciate all the good (and bad) within you, you are 1/3 of the way there in becoming an Unusually Excellent leader. A strategy is different than a plan, and an Unusually Excellent leader keeps both in the back of his or her mind at all times. Finally, there is a distinct difference between a "good fail," a "bad fail," and a "bad success." You'll learn all of that and more once you turn to page 1.
