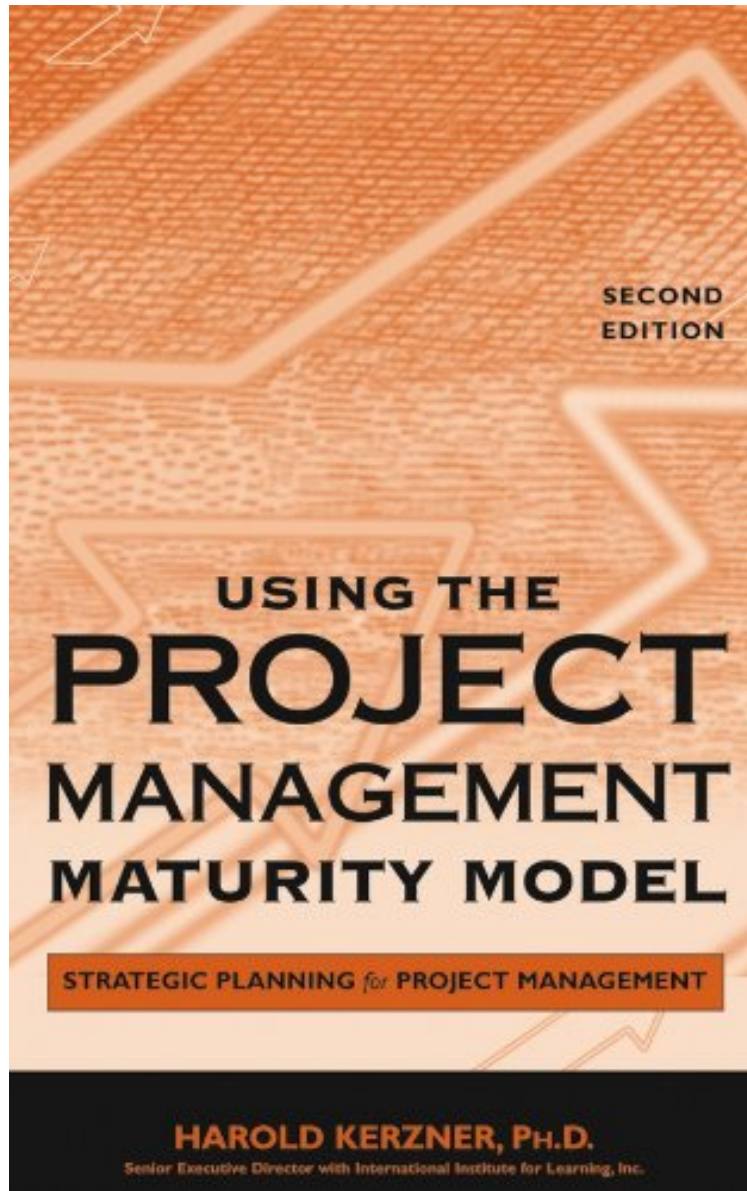

It is extremely boring to look at even though the information is engaging and well-developed. The book isn't even properly divided into discernible chapters with proper headings/headnotes/footnotes/runners/titles/page numbers. The index in the back is horrible. Good luck being able to find a particular Figure or Table on demand without having to always refer to the Table of Contents. I can't tell you how awful this book looks. This edition of the book is 10 years old and in desperate need of an update. Kerzner talks a lot about communication and the importance of communication in modern business; however, this book hasn't been updated since every human on the planet put a smartphone in his pocket. A lot has changed in the field of instantaneous, global communication practices since 2005. I learned more from this book and the two associated graduate-level courses which required its use than I did from all the other courses that semester combined. The beauty of this book and Kerzner's PMMM (now called KPM3, I think) is that he focuses as much (or more) on the satisfaction of the labor force/worker, as he does on big, shrewd, miserly, heartless, faceless American businesses.
